



## Teaching Associate Professor of Dutch

The Department of Germanic and Slavic Languages and Literatures (<http://gsll.unc.edu/>) at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is seeking a superior and innovative Teaching Associate Professor in Dutch.

The successful applicant will carry a 3/3 teaching load and perform service in the department. Candidates are expected to present evidence of both experience and excellence in teaching Dutch language and literature at a college or university.

Ph.D. in Germanic Languages and Literatures, or a related field, is required. Native or near-native competence in English and Dutch is required. We encourage applications from candidates whose work aligns with our departmental mission as outlined on our website. (<https://gsll.unc.edu/about-gsll/>)

Applicants must apply online at <http://unc.peopleadmin.com/postings/307024> and upload 1) a letter of application; 2) a current CV; 3) a statement of teaching philosophy; 4) two syllabi, one for a course in intermediate Dutch language, and another for a course in Dutch literature and/or culture taught in English. Additional materials may be requested at a later date.

At the time of application candidates will be required to identify the names, titles, and email addresses of four professional references, at least one of whom must be prepared to discuss teaching in detail. These recommenders must be at the Teaching Associate Professor, or Associate Professor, level or higher. Recommenders identified by the applicant will be contacted via email with instructions for uploading their letters of support. Alternatively, applicants may request that Interfolio send their recommendations.

Open until filled; review of applications will begin on October 10, 2025. Interviews will be conducted via Zoom.
